As you consider supplemental funding for the coronavirus outbreak (COVID-19), we respectfully request the inclusion of \$100 million for the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

While the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services maintains primary responsibility for this event at the federal level, state and local emergency managers are already conducting pivotal functions to protect the American people. Prior to the Public Health apparatus achieving full operating status, emergency managers are already coordinating activities across state and local agencies. Additional funds could allow state and local governments to:

- Augment ongoing disaster preparations, responses, and recoveries for other events;
- Activate Emergency Operations Centers for monitoring, interagency coordination, and response activities;
- Increase coordination with Public Health and K-12 partners;
- Conduct more inter-agency training and exercise opportunities across governments, and;
- Enhance strategic communications and public outreach to educate the general public on mitigation and preparedness strategies.

This all-encompassing situation is a perfect example of the reach of a program like EMPG which builds the capacity for states and locals to coordinate an issue such as COVID-19. The flexibility of the program is critical in the absence of any direct federal assistance, and the dollar-for-dollar match highlights the partnership across all levels of government. This request is not meant to detract from additional Public Health needs but is rather an opportunity for you to help state and local governments weather the storm at the operational level until such time as additional resources and capabilities can be provided and coordinated.
